LEARN THE PARTY & THE RULES

Know how the state central committee is structured and what laws it is governed by.

Party Officers elected by the delegates include:

- Chair, Co-Chair
- Administrative Vice Chair
- Coalitions Vice Chair
- Ethnic Vice Chair
- Grassroots Vice Chair
- Outreach Vice Chair
- Youth Vice Chair
- National Committeeman
- National Committeewoman

State Committee Bylaws establish the role of party officers, the membership and voting rights, the standing subcommittees and more. The bylaws are available at MIGOP.org.

DO THE MATH

Delegates (and Alternates)

Traditionally, 2000 delegates and 2000 alternates have been apportioned between the counties and county portions of each congressional district based on the most recent election results for the Republican Secretary of State or Presidential candidate.

Delegates At Large

Per MCL 168.595a, all incumbent members of the state legislature are delegates at large to Republican county, district and state conventions. Past state convention rules have also given delegate at large status to state party officers, statewide government officials and even state party committee members. For these rules to remain in effect, they need to be reapproved each time.

A majority vote from state delegates and delegates at large must be achieved to elect state party officers.

BUILD A CORE TEAM & STRATEGY

Precinct Strategy success depends on a dedicated team of individuals *in each county or county portion of the district* who can share the workload of recruitment, communication, training, candidate support, convention prep and more. Leaders of each county team within the congressional district must collaborate.

One or more leaders from each congressional district team must collaborate on a statewide level to decide which party officer candidates to support (or recruit!).

WIN AT COUNTY & DISTRICT CONVENTIONS

CAMPAIGN

After county convention, the convention chairperson must submit the list of elected state delegates and alternates to the state central committee. Any state delegate or alternate may request the list for their county.

Consolidate the state delegate and alternate lists for each congressional district and the entire state.

Obtain graphics or campaign literature for each party officer you want to support. Share these with all state delegates and alternates.
