CLEAN UP THE QUALIFIED VOTER FILE (QVF)

The database of registered voters in Michigan is called the Qualified Voter File and is under the oversight of the Michigan Secretary of State. A corrupted voter database equals corruptible elections.

CheckMyVote.org is a non-partisan organization specifically focused on restoring election integrity. The CMV platform helps identify and rectify irregularities in voter rolls and is operational in Michigan!

BECOME AN ELECTION INSPECTOR

Election inspectors (aka poll workers) are hired, paid, and trained local government workers who assist with running local elections in compliance with Michigan Election Law.

Each county, city, and township in Michigan hires and pays election inspectors for the early voting period and on Election Day.

Election inspectors may be assigned different responsibilities. At a polling place or early voting site, election inspectors greet and check-in voters, issue ballots, and assist with tabulation. Individuals may also be hired to assist at absent voter ballot-processing facilities.

According to Michigan Compiled Law (MCL) 168.674 (2), a local board of election commissioners “shall appoint at least 1 election inspector from each major political party and shall appoint an equal number, as nearly as possible, of election inspectors in each election precinct from each major political party.” The chairs of each major political party receive the list of all election inspectors appointed within the county and can challenge the qualifications and party affiliation of appointees.

BECOME AN ELECTION INSPECTOR (continued)

MCL 168.677, 168.680 and 168.683 set forth the qualifications, application, eligibility, appointment, oath of office, instruction and compensation of election inspectors.

Apply to be an election inspector! There are a few ways to do this.

1. Contact your county party before May 15 and ask them to nominate you for election inspector to the city and township clerks in your county.
2. Contact the clerk of the cities or townships you are interested in working for, ask them about serving as an election inspector and submit an official application.

BECOME A POLL CHALLENGER

Poll challengers are volunteers who work on behalf of a political party or other credentialing organization to ensure elections are conducted in an open, fair and orderly manner.

Challengers may be assigned to work at:

- Polling locations
- Election day vote centers
- Absent voter counting boards
- Clerk's offices

MCL 168.730 (2) A challenger shall be a registered elector of this state. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a candidate for nomination or election to an office shall not serve as a challenger at the election in which he or she is a candidate. A candidate for the office of delegate to a county convention may serve as a challenger in a precinct other than the 1 in which he or she is a candidate. A person who is appointed as an election inspector at an election shall not act as a challenger at any time during the election day.

MCL 168.727, 168.733 and 168.734 describe the rights and duties of poll challengers.

BECOME A POLL CHALLENGER

To become a poll challenger, contact your county party and let them know you would like to be trained and credentialed for the upcoming election(s)!

COLLECT PRECINCT ELECTION RESULTS

Ask for the election vote numbers, or tabulator tapes, from precinct polling locations on election night to verify accuracy of election results posted online.

MCL 168.807 Election results; availability

Immediately after the canvass has been completed, the result, stating the total number of votes received by each person voted for in said precinct for any office and the number of votes for and the number of votes against any proposed constitutional amendment or other submitted proposition, shall be made available to interested persons who may be present.

GATHER EVIDENCE OF ELECTION FRAUD

Work with other election integrity warriors to analyze election results and identify anomalies.

Canvas your precinct: identify phantom voters.

Use the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) to obtain public records, including Qualified Voter File downloads, video surveillance of ballot drop boxes, and more!

Fight election crime.
