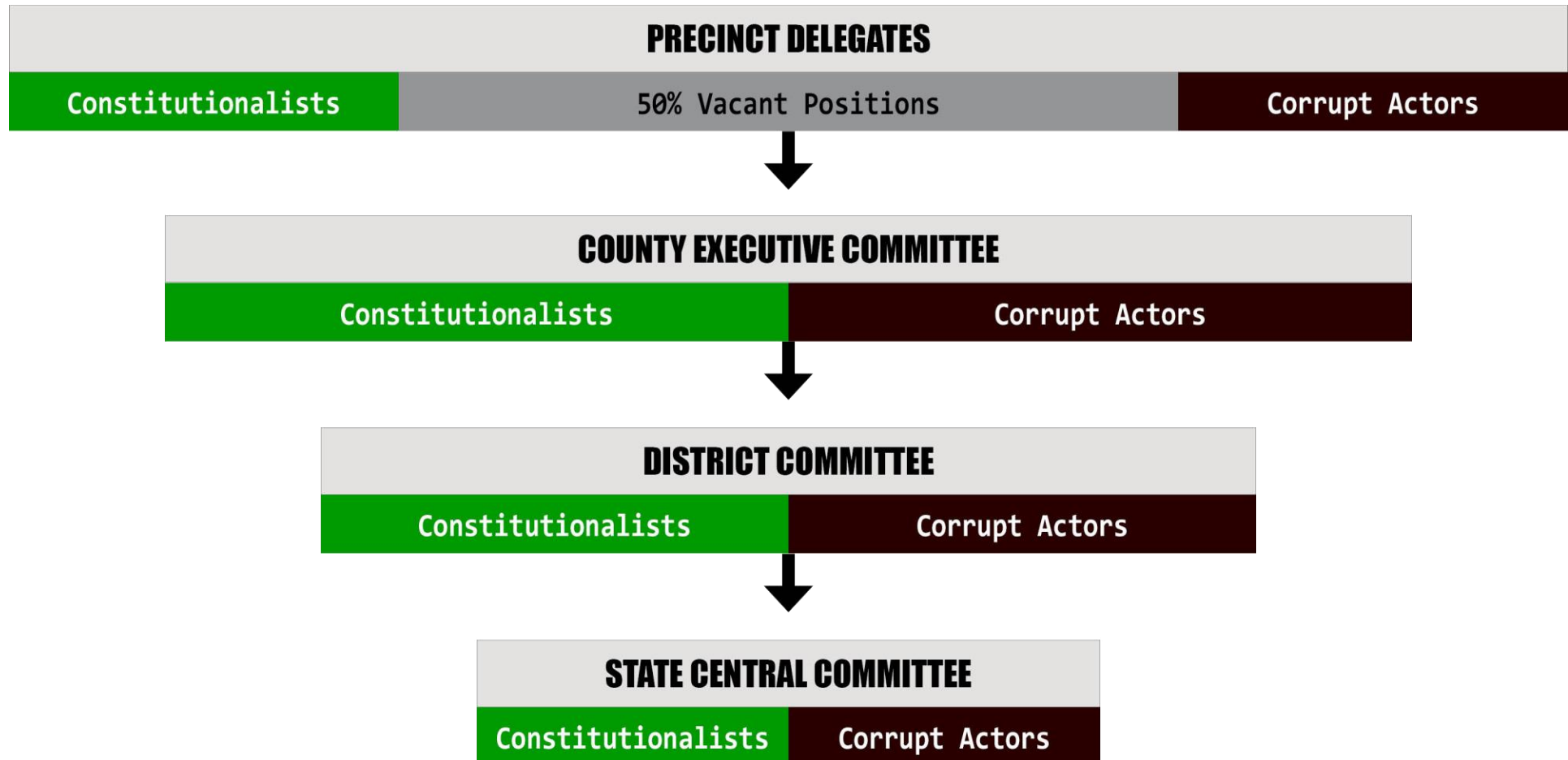
**Both political parties have been rotten to the core for many decades due to infiltration by enemies of God and country.**

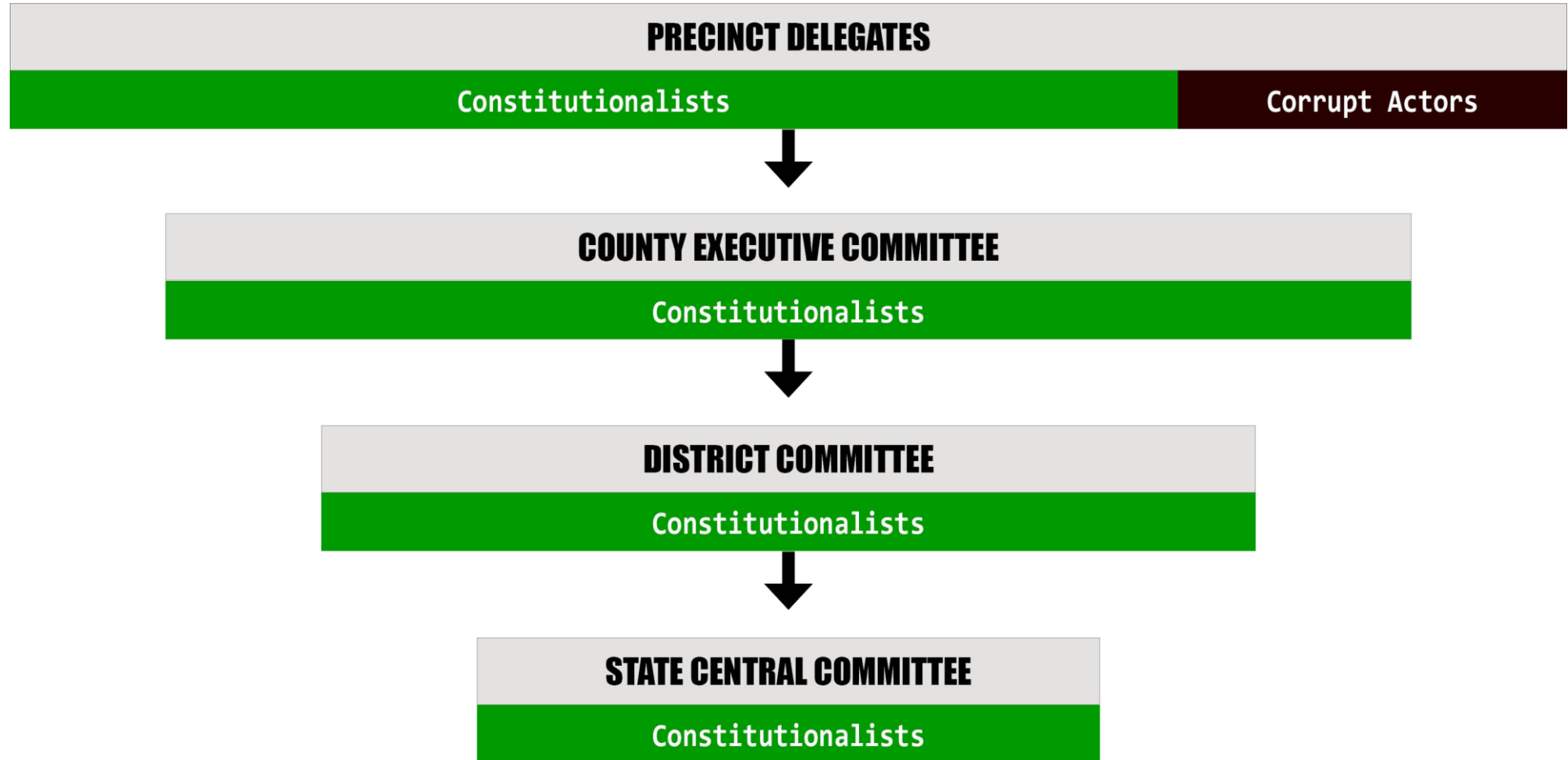
# Both political parties have been deconstructed from the inside-out.



# POWER 3

---

INCREASE  
VOTER  
TURNOUT BY  
30%

- There are no more than 5,000 active registered voters per precinct.
- Studies have shown that an active and trustworthy delegate can increase voter turnout in their precinct by 30%!
- $30\% \text{ of } 5,000 = 1,500 \text{ votes}$
- The outcome of a state legislative race is often decided by a few hundred votes. This means one active and trustworthy delegate can single-handedly alter the outcome of a state legislative race.
- Multiply that by hundreds and thousands of delegates, and you can transform the state.

# METHOD 1

---

## ELECTED BY VOTERS

- File an **Affidavit of Identity** to run for precinct delegate.
- Locate the Affidavit of Identity on the Secretary of State website (exact date and time of the filing deadline is listed on the Affidavit).
- Complete the Affidavit, double-check for accuracy, sign in the presence of a notary (available at most local banks) and submit via mail or in person to the County Clerk by the filing deadline.
- August Primary Election: Names of all individuals who filed to be delegates will be listed on the primary ballot for the party they filed under.
- If running uncontested, must receive at least one vote.

### **MORE CANDIDATES RUNNING THAN SEATS AVAILABLE? CAMPAIGN!**

Campaign strategy should include door-knocking and distribution of literature (postcards, brochures, palm cards, business cards...) introducing yourself to voters. It may also include planting a few campaign yard signs (subject to municipal ordinances). If there is more than one precinct delegate opening, consider joining campaign efforts with like-minded delegate candidates in your precinct!

NOTE: Campaign finance law does NOT require precinct delegate candidates to file reports of any campaign expenses.

# METHOD 2

---

## WRITE-IN CANDIDATE

- Individuals who missed the filing deadline for submitting their Affidavit of Identity (or had it rejected for errors) may still win in the Primary Election as a “write-in candidate”.
- Locate the **Write In Declaration of Intent** on the Secretary of State website. Complete the Declaration and double-check for accuracy.
- Sign in the presence of an election inspector (authorized to act as notary on election day) and submit form at polling location.
- Fill in an oval next to one of the blank spaces for precinct delegate on the ballot and write in your name exactly as written on the Declaration of Intent. Ask your neighbors and friends if they would be willing to do the same!

**Consider running as a Write-In Candidate ONLY if there are fewer candidates for precinct delegate than seats available! It's impossible to win otherwise.**

# METHOD 3

---

ELECTED BY  
DELEGATES TO  
FILL A  
VACANCY

- Any vacancies remaining in precinct delegation after the August Primary Election may be filled by a majority vote of delegates at any county convention.
- Only citizens residing in the vacant precinct can fill that vacancy.
- Precinct delegates elected at convention to fill vacancies may vote at all remaining county conventions in the two-year term
